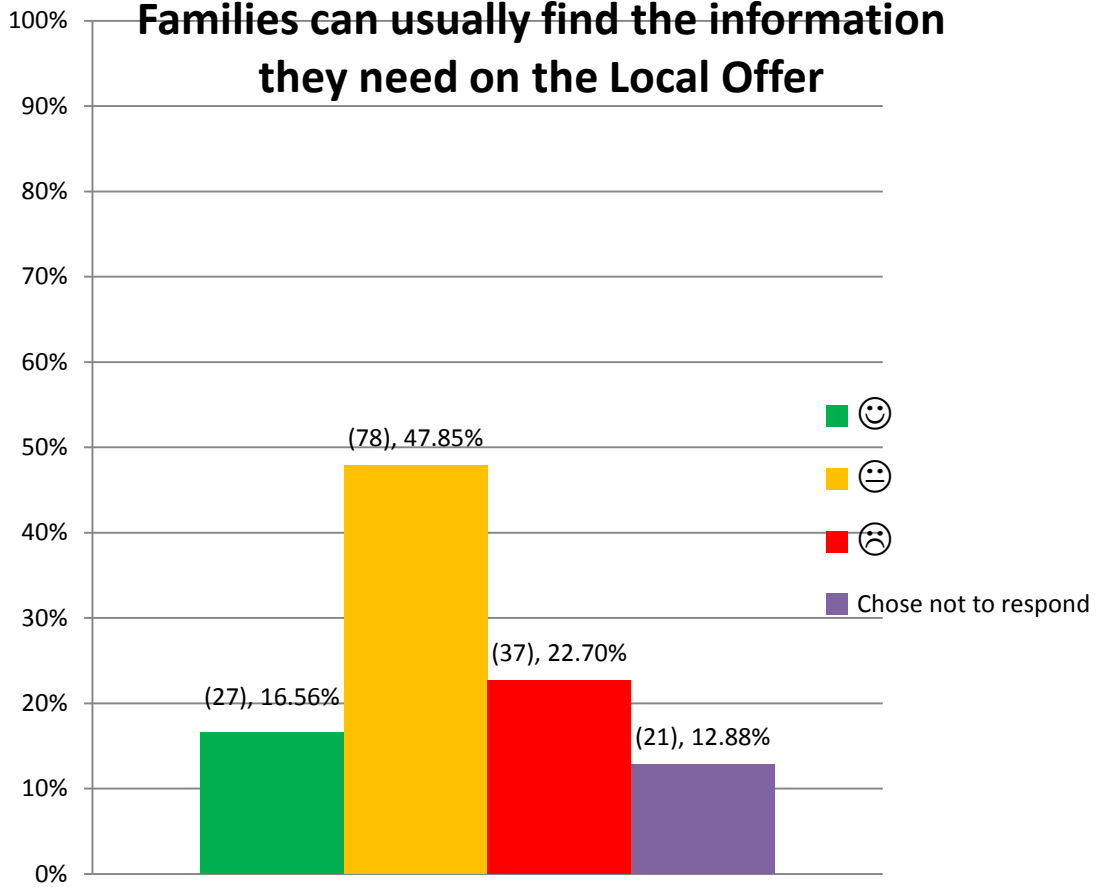

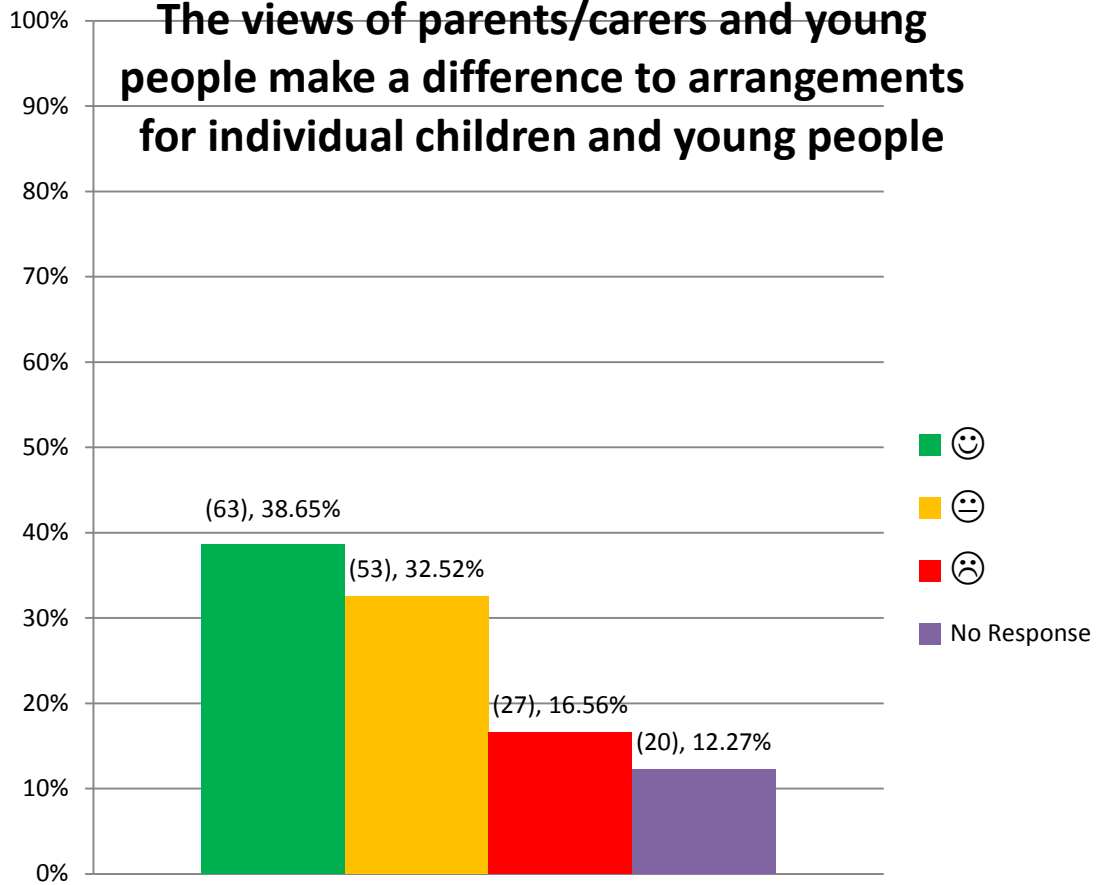

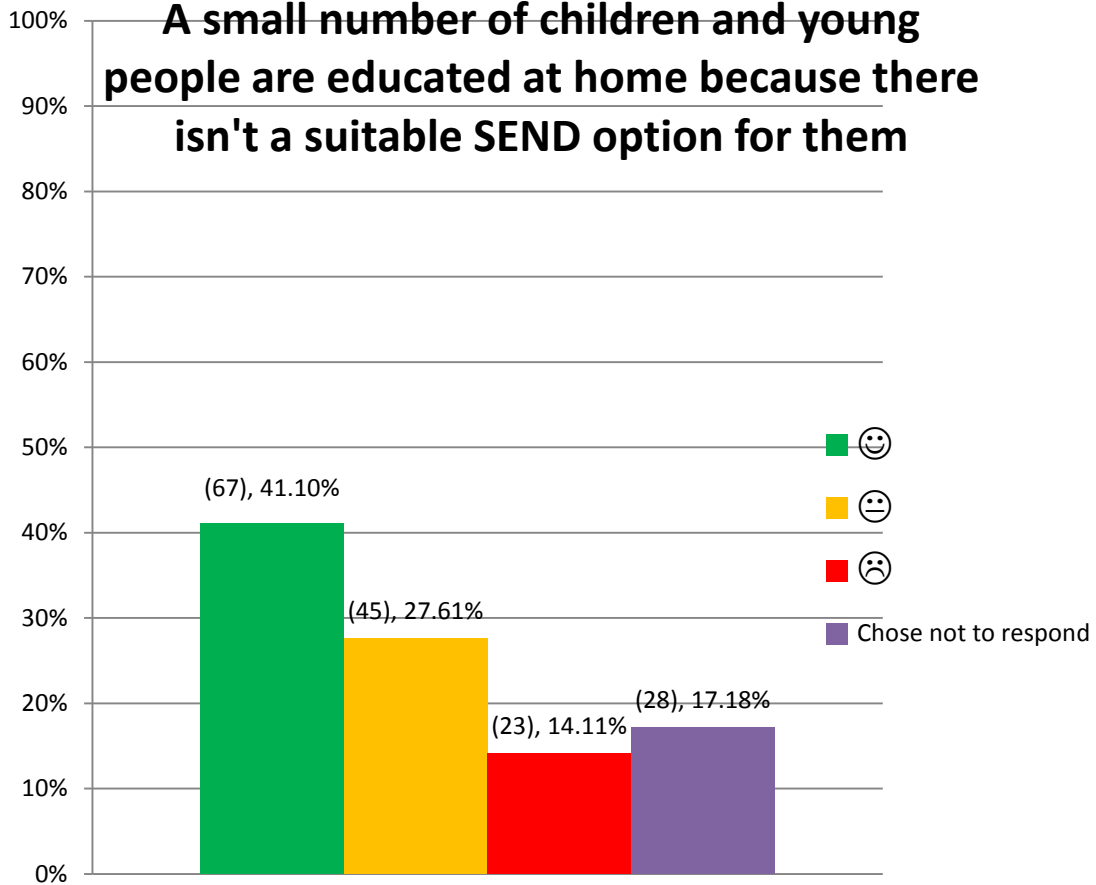

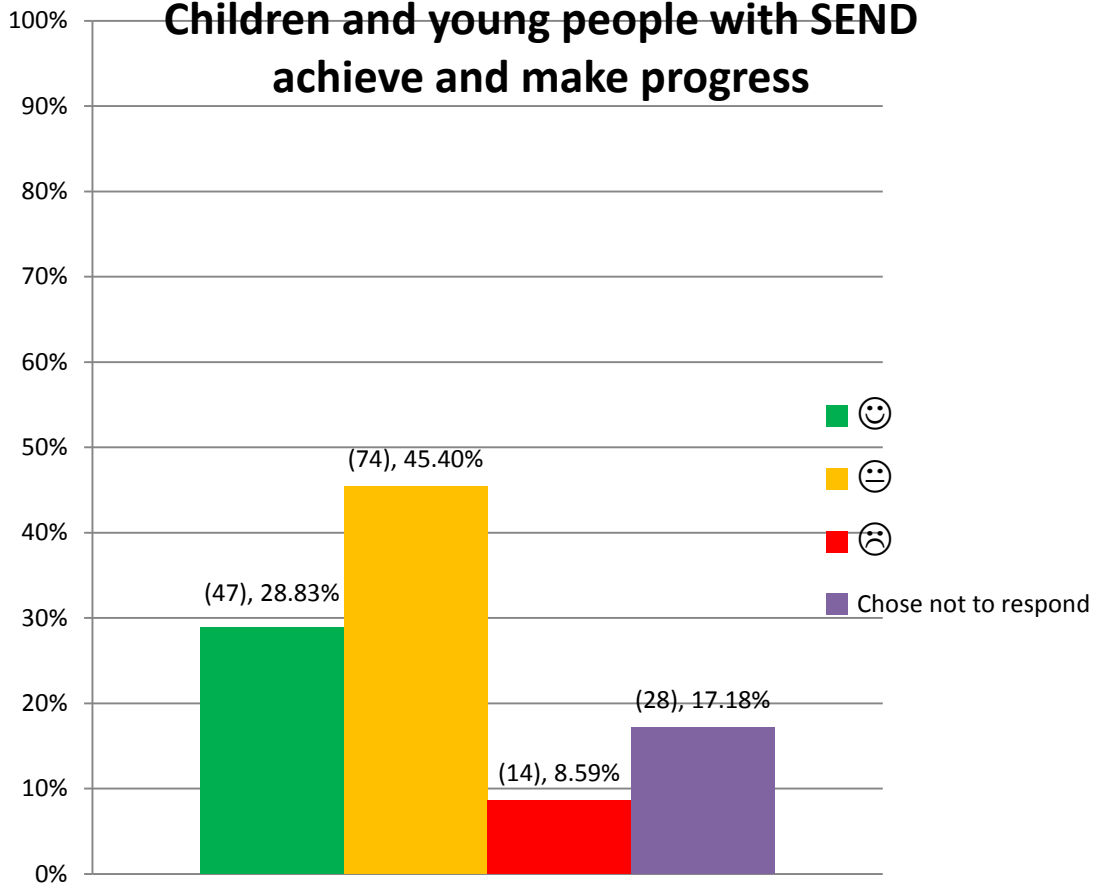

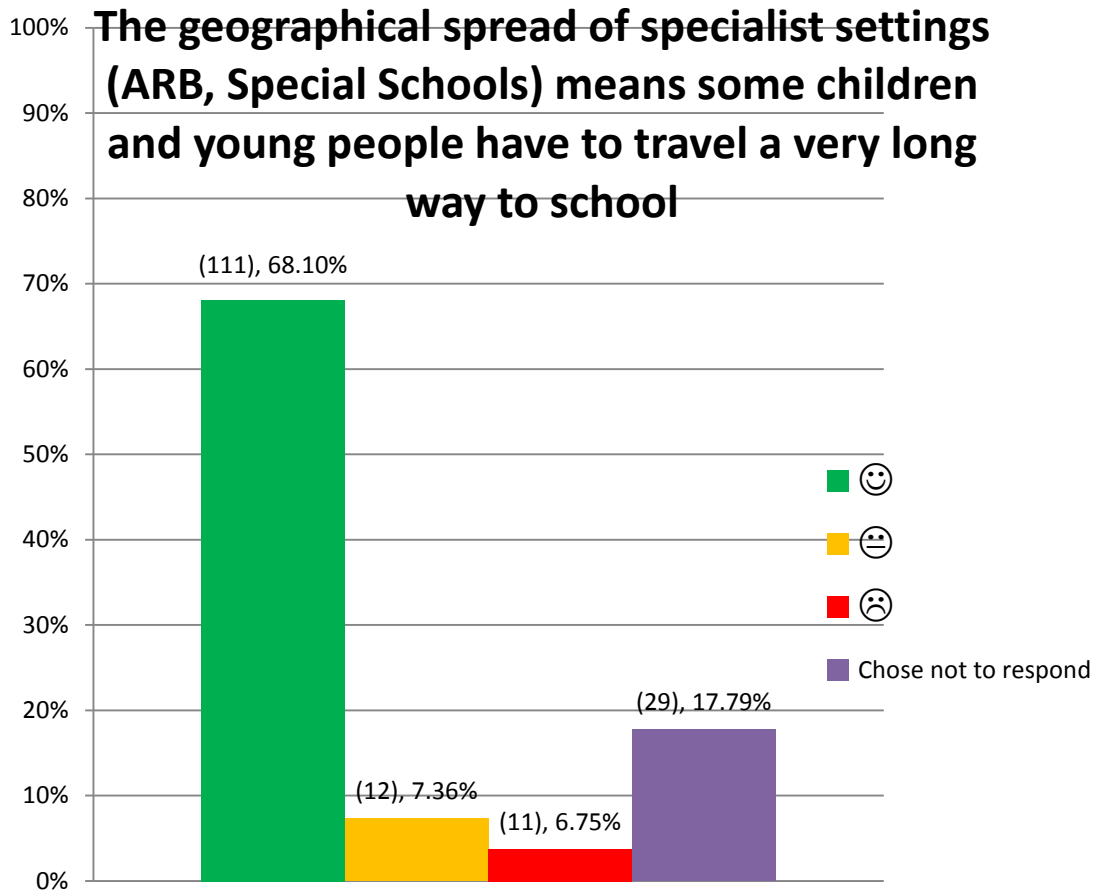


## A small number of children and young people are educated at home because there isn't a suitable SEND option for them

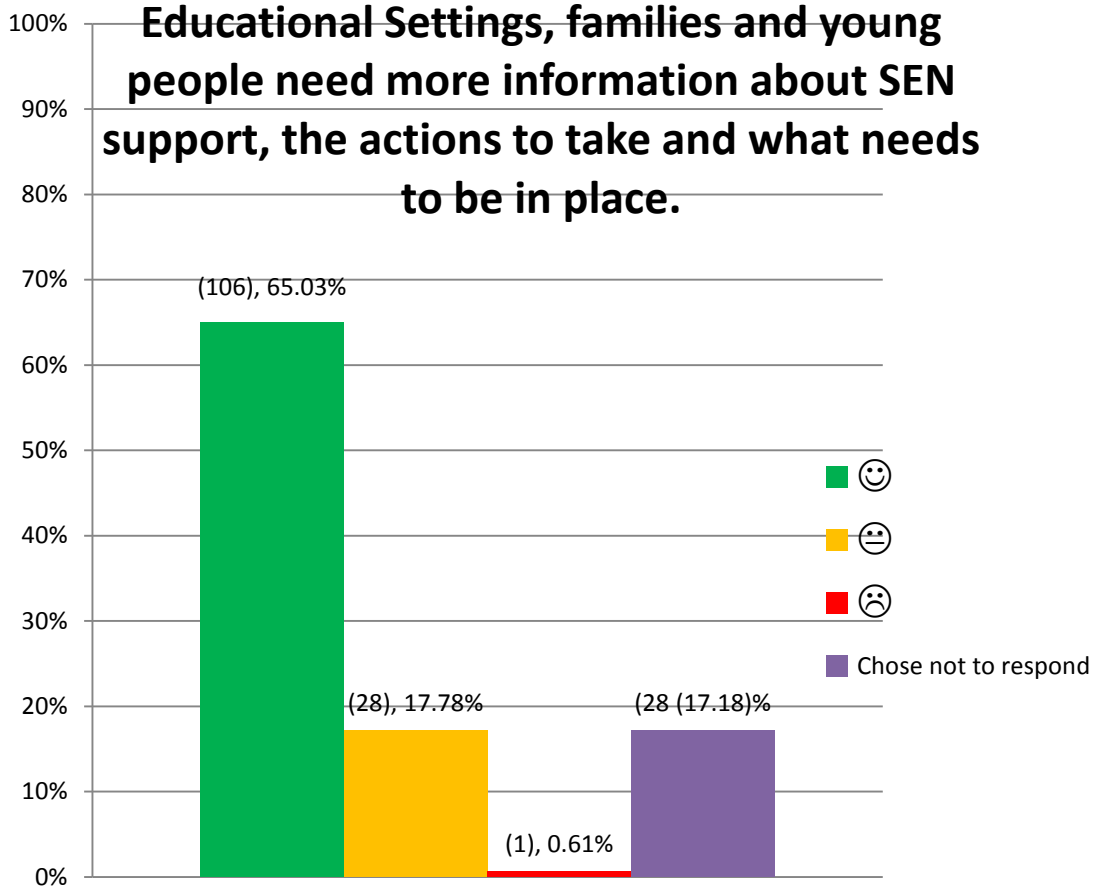

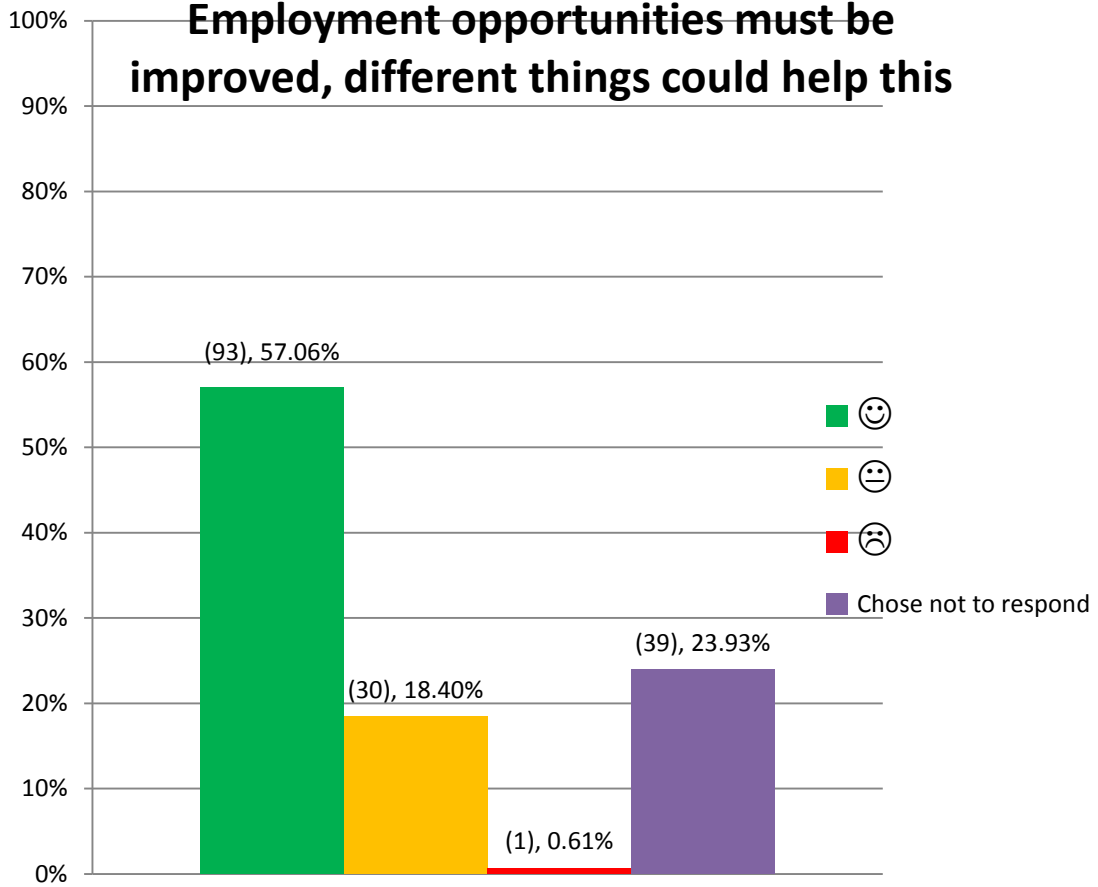

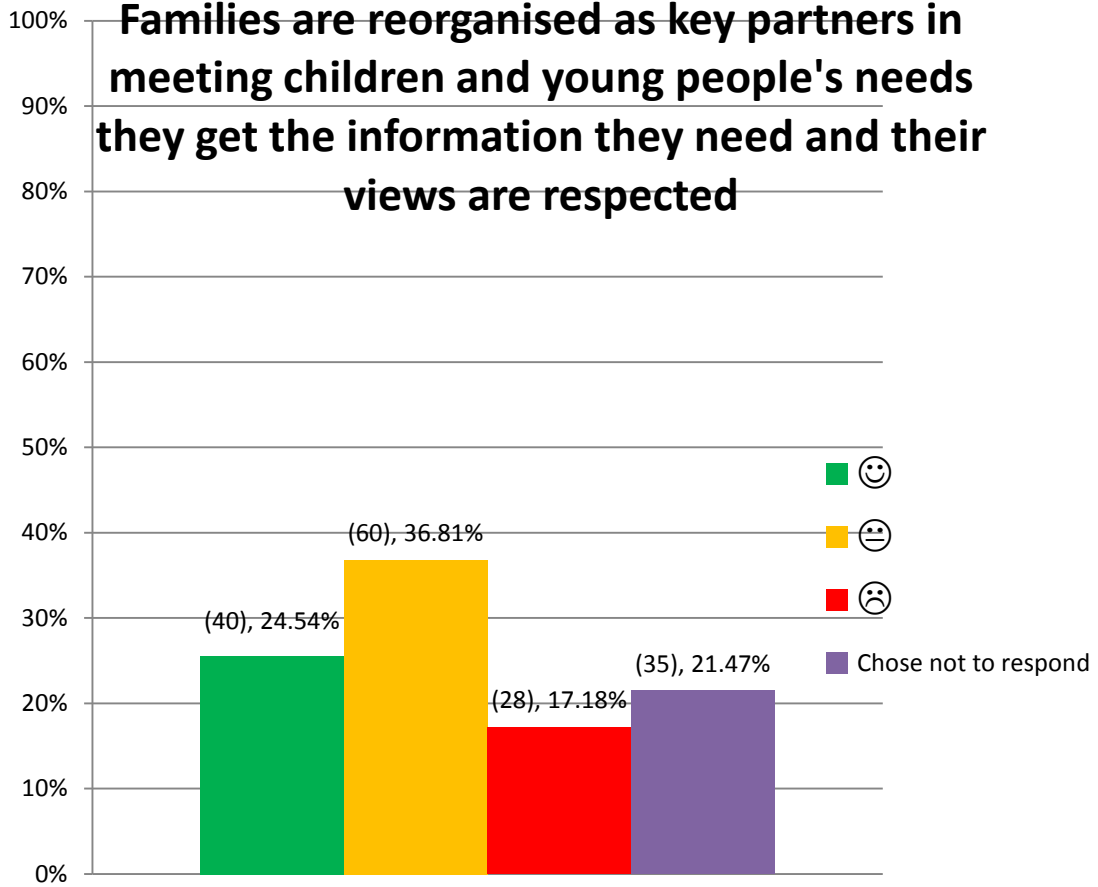
## Services work together in the best interests of children and young people
