	Agenda Item	Action
1	<p>Welcome, introductions and apologies</p> <p>SK welcomed everyone to the meeting and explained the fire regulations. All apologies were noted.</p>	
2	<p>Notes of last meeting – 15th September 2016</p> <p>They were agreed as a true record.</p>	
3	<p>Devon & Cornwall Police Update</p> <p>Unfortunately no one was available to attend tonight, as there was a major accident on the A39 in Wadebridge.</p> <p>If anyone has information please do contact the police by email 101@dc.police.uk or call 101.</p>	
4	<p>CCTV</p> <p>SK welcomed Kevin Thomas and Sarah Kind from Cornwall Fire Rescue Service and David Eaton from Office of Police and Crime Commissioners.</p> <p>Currently the fire service, monitor CCTV in eight town councils in Cornwall. The cameras are watched at Tolvaddon, keeping a 30 day recording of all footage. The system monitors crime as well as helping and protecting the vulnerable. Since taking it over a murder was recorded, rapes were reported and several children and lost people were found.</p> <p>The system that is currently used by the Councils that have signed up is as follows:</p> <p>Cameras link together via wifi, which goes to Digital Video Recorder normally hosted at the Town Hall, which is connected by a fibre link to New County Hall (which helps if there is an emergency and the bunker is used) and also takes footage direct to Tolvaddon.</p> <p>Localism will be issuing an invitation to everyone to visit the Critical Control Centre to see the system in action.</p> <p>David Eaton provided background into the Police and Crime Plan 2017-2020 "Safe, resilient and connected communities" sets out a commitment from the PCC to support local</p>	

	<p>authorities that wish to invest in CCTV systems.</p> <p>A budget of £200,000 has been allocated over three years, which is for capital funding.</p> <p>Any Town/Parish council wishing to express an interest will be considered. It will not be a first come first served, so there is no rush to complete – just need to show an interest, closing date is Friday 21st April. Interest form and background information included with the notes.</p> <p>It is hoped that the technology will soon provide live footage through the police phones. Safeguarding is important and where residential properties are in site, they are recorded but blanked out for privacy.</p> <p>There are menus of options available; as it is recognised that every area is different. No evidence of crime levels are required to obtain cameras.</p> <p>The local contractors, SSC are happy to come for free and advise a Town/Parish Council what could be provided.</p> <p>Informal discussions are welcome now. <p>5</p>	<p>Camel Trail Partnership</p> <p>SK welcomed Simon Garner from CORMAC, who gave a detailed presentation – attached.</p> <p>The Camel Trail is an eighteen mile multi use trail running along the Camel Valley. It runs from the fringe of Bodmin Moor at Wentford Coal Yard to the Estuary at Padstow. Making use of redundant railway lines.</p> <p>The Camel Trail Partnership (CTP) is made up of all parish councils and interested parties along the trail and aims to ensure a consistent high level of maintenance.</p> <p>A debate took place with regard to the reestablishment of the railway and JP answered those questions on behalf of the CTP.</p>	<p>SG</p>

	<p>Fire Service reported a problem with the emergency keys SG suggested advised that they were always happy for chains to be cut by the emergency services to ensure access.</p> <p>SG & JP was thanked for their attendance, which was very informative and useful.</p>
