Petition: Opposing new parking proposals collected in Penryn Town Centre

Thank you for your email dated 2 December 2016 regarding the above matter, and for supplying the accompanying petition to the Council. The petition is being handled in accordance with the Council's Petition Scheme.

As the petition did not achieve 5000 subscribers it is being handled as an ordinary petition. The Council has therefore decided to refer it to me, as the appropriate officer, in order for a response to be provided.

The purpose of the informal engagement that Cornwall Council undertook last year was to gather feedback on the proposals to introduce on-street paid for parking, and additional residential permit zones within certain towns in Cornwall, of which Penryn was one.

The feedback that we have received, including a number of petitions, has now been collated and will be reviewed by the Council before making a decision as to whether to proceed with any of the proposals.

Please be aware that a formal consultation is required by law before any new traffic regulation orders can be introduced, and if proposals are approved this would be the next step. This will enable all interested parties to submit formal feedback during the legal process.

If it is decided to proceed with a formal consultation, notifications will be made available via the Council's website and the press.

The petition has been brought to the attention of Councillor Biscoe (Portfolio Holder for Transport) and the Local Members for Penryn. Apart from this response it is not proposed that any other action is taken in relation to the petition; however, please do not hesitate to contact me if you require any further advice or assistance.
