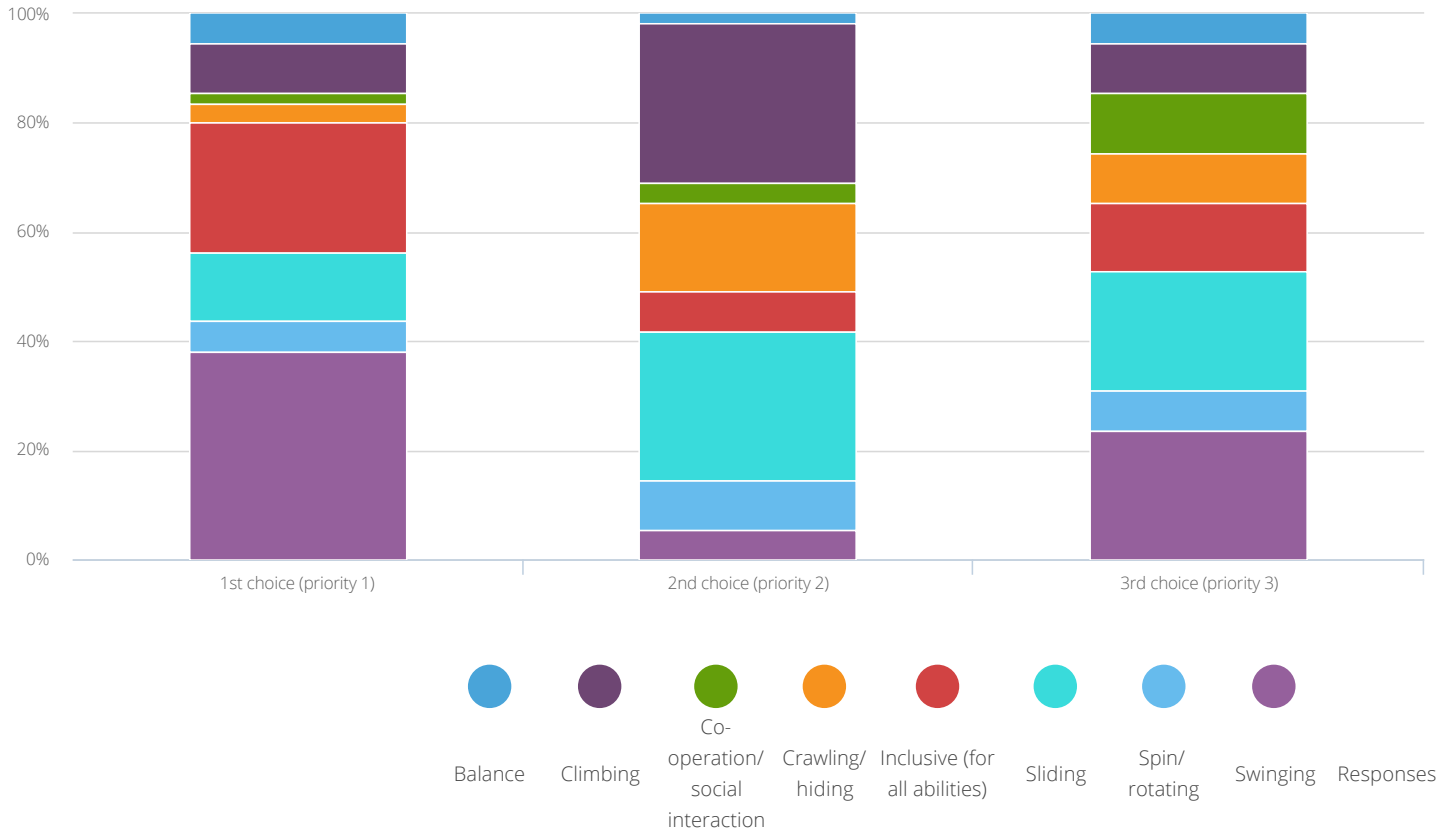

Rats!

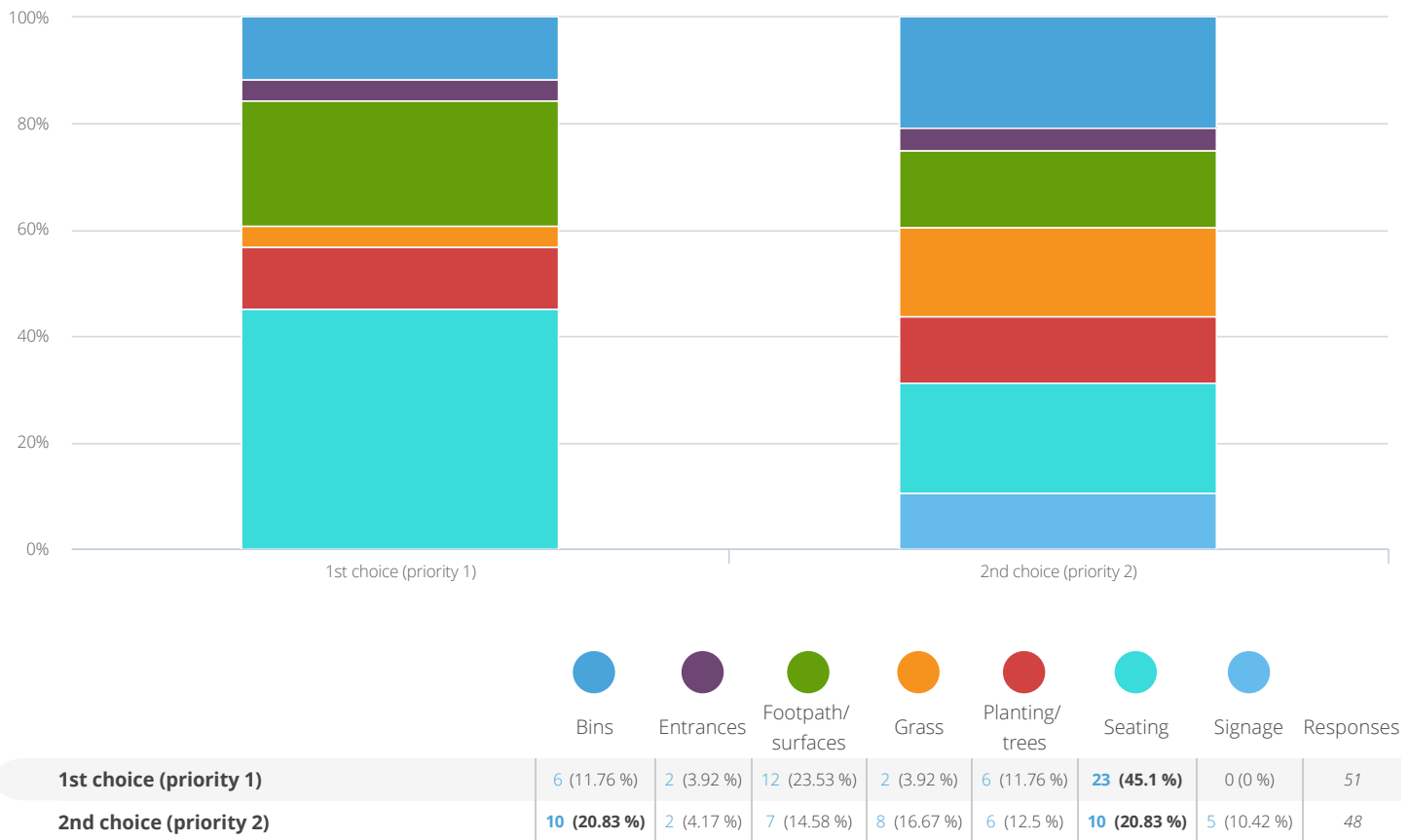
