<b>1</b>	<p><b>Introductions</b></p> <p>CW welcomed everyone and invited MOB to advise on the health and safety and housekeeping issues. Introductions were made and apologies given.</p>	
<b>2</b>	<p><b>Election of Chair and Vice-Chair (Chaired by Mark O'Brien)</b></p> <p>MOB invited nominations from the members for Chair of the Panel. Councillors Chris Wells and Bob Richards were both nominated as Chair for the forthcoming year.</p> <p>Through a show of hands from those eligible to vote, Cllr Chris Wells received a majority of the support and was duly elected as the Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel Chair for the next 12 months.</p> <p>Councillor Wells thanked everyone for their support and took back chairing responsibilities for the meeting.</p> <p>Councillor Wells asked for a show of hands in relation to electing Cllr Bob Richards as vice-chair of the panel and following unanimous support Councillor Richards was elected as the Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel Vice-Chair for the next 12 months</p>	
<b>3</b>	<p><b>Terms of Reference</b></p> <p>It was suggested that we state 'Tuesday' as the day of the meeting. The Chair decided it was best to leave it non-specific to allow future flexibility.</p> <p>Mark O'Brien's job title on page 9 to be amended to Community Link Officer.</p>	<b>SSa</b>

<b>4</b>	<p><b>Schedule of Meetings 2015/16</b></p> <p>The proposed schedule of meetings was agreed – SSa to forward electronic invites.</p> <p>Discussions took place regarding the option of alternating the venue to different Parishes if appropriate. Members continued to support this approach.</p>	<b>SSa</b>
<b>5</b>	<p><b>Notes of last Panel meeting (14 March 2017)</b></p> <p>Speeding  <i>Grampound PC has heard that the Police have stopped taking in the results sheets and are no longer producing the letters due to lack of resources. PCW to investigate this.</i></p> <p><b>MOB to follow up</b></p>	<b>MOB</b>
<b>6.</b>	<p><b>Speedwatch Update</b></p> <p>Speeding has been discussed at the previous two meetings. One of the main issues that was raised was the difficulty in setting up Speedwatch Groups. Eleanor Grey (Devon and Cornwall Police) has now been tasked in helping potential speed groups. The following groups are currently being assisted by Eleanor:</p> <p>Grampound Road  Grampound  Feock  Carnon Downs  Ladock  Menna  Chacewater  Probus</p> <p>BE informed the group that Grampound/Probus currently have 5 volunteers but the group is not official yet as they still require further training. There has been a dramatic change in attitude with the police and the issue has definitely moved forward.</p> <p>MEG stated that St. Clement are also interested in setting up a group.</p>	

	<p>BR said that Feock have also received training and would like to extend their thanks to Ellie for her support, she does a really good job as 'speedwatch' is an add on to her day job.</p> <p>RK informed the group that Chacewater currently have 19 volunteers interested.</p> <p>MOB informed the group that the community support from Eleanor is for a limited time period (ending in September) so if anyone's council is thinking of setting up a Speedwatch group they need to register their interested asap.</p> <p>LR stated that he is currently in contact with Ellie regarding areas of Truro.</p> <p>JD said that with regards to the A390, Kenwyn Parish Council could be interested. IH asked for further information.</p> <p>CW stated that the progression with regards to setting up the Speedwatch Groups across the Network has been a very positive action which has come out of the Panel Meeting held at Chaos Café back in February.</p> <p>JR enquired about how volunteers are recruited for a Speedwatch Group. Chacewater PC recruited theirs through Public Planning Days. CW advised that if anyone wishes to start a group to get in touch with their Parish Council.</p> <p>BE said to first find a coordinator for a group who will then push forward with the scheme as someone needs to own it.</p> <p>Following discussion at previous Panel Meetings, MOB looked into the Government's guidelines for reducing speed limits in rural settlements. MOB had enquired as to whether we could look to seek additional local powers through the <i>Cornwall Deal</i> with central government. MOB reported that following investigation into this, officers in Highways had informed him that they do currently have all of the local discretion that they feel they need to do this.</p> <p>RN asked MOB to speak to Highways with regards to Daniel Street, Truro as they recently declined a request to make it a 20mph zone. MOB noted that the advice he had sought was in relation to rural hamlets and settings so wasn't sure if the same discretion applied, but was happy to make an enquiry.</p> <p>RN raised concerns about new developments and the existing speed zones. 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<b>7.</b>	<p><b>Traffic Management (standing item)</b></p> <p>A390 Truro</p> <p>JD stated that the progress of works is very slow and the item needs to be kept on the Agenda.</p> <p>RN raised concerns at Penweathers as it is impossible to turn right onto the road.</p> <p>DH suggested that a representative from CORMAC is invited to the next Panel Meeting, either Nigel Blackler or Mark Secker.</p> <p>Discussions continued regarding Arch Hill Roundabout. It is a controversial topic with the idea that a substantial degree of manipulation to the landscape taking place to accommodate the new roundabout. There is an ethical question to this road scheme. Some felt that there was a need to hold public debate on the issue and it needs to be done quickly.</p> <p>It was suggested that the Portfolio Holder for Highways is also invited to the next meeting.</p>	<p><b>MOB</b></p> <p><b>MOB</b></p>
<b>8.</b>	<p><b>Issues raised by Panel Members</b></p> <p><u>Cllr Armored Carlyon – Truro City Council</u></p> <p>AC raised concerns relating to South West Water and the proposed developments in Truro (West Langarth).</p> <p>BB has recently had discussions with SWW Engineers and he felt that he didn't elicit answers to all the questions he was asking. They did produce a map to show planned works, which looks like it has changed from an original plan.</p> <p>It was also reported that it was challenging to get SWW engaged in the Neighbourhood Plan process.</p> <p>BR stated that there are a number of multi build projects in Carnon Downs and SWW has commented to say that the sewage system is inadequate but they are not helping to resolve this issue. Planning Officers didn't seem to feel this was an issue.</p>	

<p>SC informed the group that SWW have a 5 year funding plan and there is a need to find out what the funding level is for Truro within this plan.</p> <p>It was agreed that a representative of SWW should be invited to a future Panel Meeting potentially with someone from Public Health .</p> <p><u>Chacewater Parish Council – Cllr Rob Knill</u></p> <p>RK raised concerns around the lack of verge and drain clearing. This should be on a regular scheduled maintenance list. SC suggested RK adds any problem areas to the 'hot spot list' which is given to CORMAC. Truro City Council informed the group that they employ their own staff to undertake certain jobs.</p> <p><u>Social Prescribing – Mark O'Brien</u></p> <p>MOB informed the panel about various strands of work in the network area in relation to well-being. This was partly off the back of previous panel discussions around the health Sustainable Transformation Plan (STP) "Shaping Our Future". Feock Parish Council, Truro City Council and the Roseland Patient Group were all showing an interest in getting involved in local wellbeing initiatives as were organisations including NHS Kernow, Age UK, Truro Health Park, Volunteer Cornwall and others.</p> <p>The focus was around helping to support people to continue to have healthy and active lifestyles and stay connected in the communities in which they live. This may be around linking them up to local groups and activities or through befriending and signposting to likeminded people. GPs could signpost to a key worker who then links to people in local communities to help form those connections. MOB said that initial thoughts were around seeking funding for a coordinator, following the successful model being run in St. Austell.</p> <p>JD would like further details.</p> <p>BB said that the most important thing is that the Community can actually participate, so they can inform what they need, want and feel. The support that they previously had through the voluntary sector has been withdrawn. It is the simple and basic things that need sorting.</p>	<p><b>MOB</b></p>
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	<p>DR agrees with BB and is currently running a mini project with relation to this topic, which offers Community Health Ambassadors in: Malpas Trelander Tregurra Malabar</p> <p>The project is run alongside the Lander Medical Practice. A suggestion around setting up a sub-group for the panel to develop this idea was made however it was felt that a discussion with the whole panel would probably be more beneficial.</p> <p><b>AGREED:</b> To have a future panel meeting topic to discuss social prescribing and to invite relevant guests to help inform discussion.</p>	<b>MOB / SSa</b>
