<b>1</b>	<p><b>Welcome, introductions and apologies</b></p> <p>KM welcomed everyone to the meeting and explained the fire regulations. All apologies were noted.</p>	
<b>2</b>	<p><b>Notes of last meeting - 25 January 2017</b></p> <p>The notes were agreed by the Panel Members.</p>	
<b>3</b>	<p><b>Devon &amp; Cornwall Police Update</b></p> <p>The attached Crime Statics information sheet was circulated to the delegates.</p> <p>HL reminded the group that good weather often means that Anti-Social Behaviour increases and encouraged the delegates to report any incidents that are witnessed.</p> <p>HL also reminded the delegates to be mindful of shutting windows and locking doors when it is nice weather.</p> <p>PC Andy Stewart is a keen believer in Community Resilience and encourages everyone to look after their neighbours.</p> <p>GM raised an issues relating to a motor vehicle being broken into where the elderly ladies keys and handbag stolen. Unfortunately the lady who was in a very distressed and fraught condition did not receive any assistance from the police bar giving a crime number. The Parish Council feel that in this instance there should have been more assistance especially due to her age, the loss of her house keys etc. HL read out a response from PC Andy Stewart.</p> <p><b>ACTION:</b> GM requested a copy of the response so that it can be taken back to the PC.</p> <p>JP raised concerns around fraud/nuisance telephone calls.</p> <p><b>ACTION:</b> PS asked JP to forward the details to him.</p> <p>CM informed the group that she had attend the first meeting of the Police and Crime Commissioners Advocate scheme. Police and Crime Commissioner Alison Hernandez, as part of her commitment to community connectivity, has set up a councillor advocate scheme. The nominated Cornwall Councillor within each council will act as the link between the council, Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and local police team. 	<p>interesting and it is exactly what is need to engage with the Police.</p> <p>CM raised the issue of vehicles parking on the pavements. The Police are unable to enforce unless its an obstruction. The Council are also unable to enforce. This is an issue that is required to be dealt with a real local level. CM request parking ticket type warning levels – ‘Pavements are for people not for parking’.</p>	
<p><b>4</b></p>	<p><b>Community Speedwatch</b></p> <p>Elaine Felton circulated the attached information sheet.</p> <p>Liskeard currently have a successful Speedwatch Team, who travel around various sites. This alleviates the fears of vendettas towards the volunteers. Incidents are very rare but roaming teams can help with this.</p> <p>CM asked what happens if the policing team do not agree there is a problem in the particular area. EF stressed that a Speedwatch scheme can only operate if there is evidence to back up that there is a problem. The CC Highway Team can also help provide evidence if needed.</p> <p>The first requirement that needs to be action is the identification of suitable sites.</p> <p><b>ACTION:</b> Panel Representatives to take back Community Speed Watch information and identify possible sites for consideration and report back to AD so that a collective response can be provided to the police.</p>	<p><b>ALL</b></p>
<p><b>5</b></p>	<p><b>Strengthening Panels – Network Highways Scheme</b></p> <p>Documents have been previously circulated.</p> <p>AD provided a presentation of the Network Highways Scheme which is part of the ongoing Strengthening Panels work.</p> <p>We are looking for expressions of interest at this stage which can be highlighted on the ‘Expressions of Interest’ sheet – see attached. In order to be able to manage expectations we are asking that each voting member of the panel submits 1 EOI (although if you have two very small schemes then it may be possible to have two but please bear in mind there is limited budget) – Voting members are 1 vote per T&amp;PC and 1 vote per</p>

<p><b>6</b></p>	<p><b>Wadebridge, St. Breock &amp; Egloshayle NDP</b></p> <p>Adrian Jones, Chair of the Steering Group, joined the meeting.</p> <p>The NDP group have arranged four public consultation events, running over an 8 week period. They are currently in Regulation 14, Pre Submission Consultation with the Public. They hope to engage with people who either work or lives in the areas and also consulting with Statutory Consultees such as Natural England.</p> <p>AD advised anyone who formally wants to respond should go through the correct process.</p> <p>The Local Plan has indicated 1100 (minimum) new homes are to be built by 2030. As that figure is a minimum, AJ hopes that it won't double as they do have capacity to go to 2500. A NDP will help to control the numbers.</p> <p>CM raised concerns around the B3144.</p> <p>AJ informed the group that hard copies of the NDP can be found in the Library and in the Town Hall Foyer.</p> <p><a href="#">Wadebridge, St.Breock &amp; Egloshayle NDP</a></p>

<p><b>8</b></p>	<p><b>Cornwall Councillor Update</b></p> <p><u>Cllr McHugh</u></p> <p>KMc informed the group that at Tuesdays Full Council Meeting, the Council voted and agreed to fund the Stadium for Cornwall Project for in the region of £3m. The debate can be viewed on the Cornwall Council Web Cast page.</p> <p><a href="#">Full Council - 17 April 2018</a></p> <p><u>Cllr Buscombe</u></p> <p>RB has recently been investigating Traders permissions at Padstow Harbor. Unfortunately the Traders fall outside the regulations as they are not selling goods, only services. Scott Mann MP is working at Westminster to look at the situation and issues surrounding this. There will have to be a change in National Legislation to tackle the issue but further investigation regarding Devolution of Powers is taking place.</p> <p><u>Cllr Mould</u></p> <p>The Polzeath Water Bottle Refilling Station is now open with support from the Councilor Community Chest.</p>

It was suggested to raise the issue with the relevant Parish/Town Council Neighborhood Development Committee so they can address any issues in future.</p> <p><u>Graham Martin – St. Mabyn PC</u></p> <p>St Mabyn Parish Council have recently found that at least 2 planning applications were not notified to the council for comment, One application was to alter/roof over a concrete yard, the other to change usage from a shop/commercial property to domestic. In both instances Planning deemed that the Parish were not to be consulted. With the farm premises it was an "automatic" consent, but due to the nature of the farming process and the Parish wishing to comment and possibly put constraints the Parish feel that even with "automatic" consent this should have been forwarded. The second application is about the village shop/Post Office, and again due to the importance of such a facility the Parish felt that once again we should be consulted.</p> <p>AD had spoken to the Planning Department re this issue and organisations or individuals can apply to have the Planning Portal to be altered of applications but it is not possible for T&amp;PCs to be notified automatically. Provided that the applications are in the public domain, they should be included in the alerts. This would include applications like the ones which weren't notified to St Maybn.
