1	<p>Welcome Introductions & Apologies. The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Apologies to be circulated after the meeting.</p>	EA
2	<p>Community Chest Celebration Event - proposal Cllr Ian Thomas, Chairman and Charlotte Caldwell, Community Link Officer</p> <p>IT introduced the Community Chest Celebration event and talked about the benefits of the Cornwall Councillor Community Chest grants scheme. Some of the entertainers for the event who were all beneficiaries of the Community Chest grants scheme were introduced by CC & IT. Invitations were circulated and a copy is attached with the minutes.</p>	
3	<p>Prioritising CPIR Action Plan (Paper circulated with Minutes)</p> <p>CC introduced the group exercise for the Action Plan and updated on progress of two of the priorities: Number 2 (Regeneration/Economic Development) - regeneration of Camborne bus station is being considered by the Economic development and regeneration team. Number 6 (Highways) potholes - potholes should be reported using the Cornwall Council "Report It" facility. "Report It" is a system for reporting non-emergency events such as pot holes: www.cornwall.gov.uk/report-it/</p> <p>The group feedback was as follows for their top project choice to focus on;</p> <p>Group 1: Footpaths/bridleways/cyclepaths/open spaces Group 2: Highways Speedwatch and Litter/fly-tipping Group 3: Local Marketing/Promotion Group 4: Highways link 2, 3 & 4 together. Group 5: Highways link 1 & 2 together. Regeneration of Camborne bus station. Group 6: Highways 1 and 5. CC & EA to collate and send out final list for people to vote.</p>	EA/CC

<p>4</p>	<p>Highways Scheme Expressions of Interest Charlotte Caldwell, Community Link Officer</p> <p>CC recapped progress of Highways Scheme so far. At the April panel meeting AD and Cllr Geoff Brown, Portfolio holder for Transport, outlined Highways budget for each network of £50,000 per year, over the next 4 years. 14 maps have gone to Cornwall Councillors so schemes for consideration could be collated. Spreadsheet has 4 tabs Traffic Regulation Order's (viable and non-viable) all 34 viable items to be put forward for consideration in year 1. Viable schemes are 38 but costs mean only 3 of those could come forward in year 2, 3 in year 3 and 3 in year 4. Money can be rolled forward if not spent in that financial year. Waiting on 2 more Councillors to feedback then EA and CC will collate and send to Adrian Drake (Highways Manager) to be checked. Residents' feedback has been included on this but has been anonymised. SB can you boost a scheme with section 106 money? Yes DB proposed a mandate that the Chairman ask the Portfolio holder to give CPIR some of the surplus £50,000 contingency fund. Unanimous in support of DB proposal. IT reported he has already expressed his disappointment at disproportionate way funds were divided up but this was a personal view not on behalf of the CPIR panel. Yes happy to write letter on CPIR behalf. BD asked that focus of letter should be: 1. Unfair division of funds across the 19 networks and 2. Access to the contingency fund.</p> <p>IT confirmed he has received an email from Cllr Geoff Brown confirming that Cornwall Council will only fund 1 TRO per CNP per year not the associated works too. There are 34 schemes under the TRO at the moment if 1 is declined then the whole TRO will be declined. The panel needs to be really clear all items included will be approved.</p> <p>RK raised issue of disproportionate costs of speed activated signs between CORMAC and private companies. CC confirmed this is for all associated costs not just purchase of the equipment.</p> <p>GF arranging plug in points for mobile signs to be moved around and used at different points. Want sight of procurement policy for these machines and their associated costs. CC added that all 19 CNP's should go to CORMAC as a group – bulk buy will give better economies of scale.</p> <p>BE suggested that Councillors canvass the areas for the TRO work prior to it going forward to gauge public opinion, so that it stands the best chance of success. Redruth Town Council had done this successfully.</p> <p>CC said that the CNP could jointly purchase mobile speed activated signs. (MSAS)</p>	<p>EA/CC</p> <p>IT</p>
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	<p>IT reminded everyone Cornwall Council is responsible for the Highways and will instruct its Highways arm 'CORMAC' to oversee the works and unfortunately there is a cost to do that. CPIR will have to decide whether they want to purchase the signs and then pay the fees to CORMAC.</p> <p>Where there are small schemes that can be linked to a bigger scheme there would be a cost benefit but may delay progress of the scheme.</p>	
5	<p>Smartline update - Bill Voyce, Coastline Housing</p> <p>IT welcomed Bill Voyce (BV) to the meeting. BV explained the background to the project: SMARTLINE is looking at how technology can help us to live better happier lives. Geographical focus for SMARTLINE is Camborne, Pool, Illogan and Redruth. SMARTLINE runs from March 2017-February 2020. One of the project goals is to leave a legacy when the project finishes. (slides available please ask EA)</p> <p>For more details please see: https://coastlinehousing.co.uk/content/smartline</p> <p><u>Questions, Comments and Answers</u> Who owns the data and is it anonymised? Two businesses are collecting the data and participants can view their own data.</p> <p>How do you deal with external pollution to your property? The project is looking at the relationship between poor air quality outside and is it reflected within the property.</p> <p>Were any residents association involved as that would be a good way to facilitate continuation of the project? Project participants have already set up their own groups and are hoping to extend them. Residents Associations were used as starting point for this project.</p> <p>IT thanked Bill for an informative update on SMARTLINE. BV thanked the panel for making him welcome and offered to give another SMARTLINE update in November 2019.</p>	CC/EA
7	<p>Speakers Corner</p> <p>The opportunity for any member of the audience including Town & Parish Councils to raise any issues/speak on a topic of their choice.</p> <p>Josyanne Clarke and Naomi Belert - Cornwall Development Company (CDC) JC/NB - we want to introduce the new Community Led Local Development fund (CLLD) in Cornwall which is a fund of £12 million of ERDF/ESF available for Cornwall. £3 million is available across CPIR and Penryn to address deprivation in bottom 30% Indices of Multiple Deprivation (IMD) areas. We</p>	

are looking for Councillors to get involved in the decision making groups so for CC elected Members, please put your name forward to CC Democratic Services. Any organisation can apply including public/private/voluntary sector. Types of projects include business support and bringing historic buildings back into use, as two examples. Questions, Comments and Answers

Could we use it to open a town museum? NB yes if museum is in a historic building and will be used for cultural purposes. Does funding just cover one person's wages? NB staff directly involved in project can be funded but it has to be an identifiable project i.e. if a business want to expand premises so it can take on more work and employ more staff. Are there any examples of historic buildings where this has worked? JC this is a new project so nothing yet but if the purpose of the project is to bring economic benefits that would be eligible.

Helen Fearnley - Green Infrastructure for Growth (GI4G)

GI4G is an EU funded project with University of Exeter and Cornwall Council as partners. Project goal is to focus on improving Council owned spaces in 7 towns. Camborne, Pool and Redruth are the 3 relevant to this CAN. Most recently Tuckingmill has been planted to improve diversity and there has been scraping back of paths so you can get a buggy/scooter around the paths. Next week in Camborne there will be consultations at the Elim Centre, Parc-an-Tansys and Boilerworks Road. Redruth has already completed Treskerby and Trenoweth is in progress. At St Day Cemetery we want to increase biodiversity for grassland in the scrub. HF asked if anyone from Illogan/mining villages would like to see this project brought to their area please fill in forms at the Long Gallery, New County Hall, Truro on Tuesday 10th July. Helen Fearnley and Melissa Ralph will be there if you would like to find out more.

BE added if anyone wants to see example of how excellent this is, visit Treskerby Playing Field, Redruth where the wild flowers growing look wonderful and the local community has really engaged with the project.

IT asked about the possibility of further schemes with surplus funding left? HF confirmed by September we will know whether we have funding for phase 2 and this won't be geographically limited. A maximum of 3 sites per town to be delivered in all 7 towns has to be completed first.

DB asked about a site in Portreath that has been recently taken over by the Parish. Does that come under GI4G remit. One of the main funding criteria for GI4G is projects can only be on Cornwall council owned sites, if the site is leased we could help. DB to give details to HF who will look into options.

	<p>Cllr Bob Drew - Carn Brea Parish Council Remembrance Sunday on 11th November 2018 is the 100th anniversary of the end of World War One. To mark this date there will be beacons of light at locations across the country. So far over 70 locations in Cornwall have signed up. Carn Brae Parish Council aim to light the beacon at Carn Brea from 7-8pm. There will be road closures so people don't get stuck up there. The project is filling gaps from SMARTLINE with adult social care, community physio and home referrals. We are expanding coffee mornings and have attended Coastline Housing residents groups – asking if want to increase the frequency of meetings. The project also runs a Wild Group for young parents, acupuncture, pottery and art groups. The project is going well so hopefully will be extended to some of the projects that have been successful. If you know anyone who is feeling lonely isolated get in touch with the Red Cross and we will get in touch with them.
