<p><b>5</b></p>	<p><b>Devon &amp; Cornwall Police Update</b></p> <p>Please see the attached report.</p> <p>AS advised that a consultation is being undertaken regarding a proposed merger between Devon and Cornwall Police and Dorset Police. The website is now live at <a href="http://futurepolicing.co.uk/">http://futurepolicing.co.uk/</a> and includes a public survey which is open until 27 August 2018.</p> <p>A new Tri Service Station is in the pipeline, which will see Fire Staff, Ambulance Staff and Police Staff working out of the same location.</p> <p>AS thanked the WTC Members for pursuing the installation of CCTV cameras in Wadebridge.</p> <p>AS is now on Annual Leave until September until he retires from the Police. KM thanked him for his ongoing support to the Panel Meetings and to the wider community.</p>	
<p><b>6</b></p>	<p><b>Strengthening Panels – Network Highways Scheme</b></p> <p>The Panel considered 23 Expressions of Interest, submitted by Cornwall Councillors and Town &amp; Parish Councils (comments for each scheme on Appendix 1).</p> <p>It was unanimously agreed to allocate Year 1 funding for the following projects:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>WP2 – Atlantic Terrace TRO implementation</li><li>WP5 – Treceus Industrial Estate</li><li>WP12a – St. Merryn Traffic Calming – Yellow Lines</li><li>WP22 – Gonvena Cycle Lane</li><li>WP23 – High Street Padstow</li></ul> <p>OJ advised that these could be delivered within the budget and were appropriate for funding from the Network Highway Scheme.</p> <p>The panel requested that detailed designs and costings are progressed in time for consideration at the September panel meeting.</p> <p>If there are any underspent funds then the panel indicated that they would be interested in purchasing a number of mobile variable speed signs subject to costings and further information being provided by officers.</p> <p>OJ confirmed that all the other EoI will need further investigations in order to progress and that work will now be undertaken.</p>
