



Green Infrastructure for Growth – REDRUTH – 29th OCTOBER 2018
Works were completed at Treskerby, Redruth on 30th April 2018.

TRESKERBY- the meadow was cut on 04.10.18 using a Kubota rotary mower. Cuttings were left to allow flower seeds to drop, then arisings were be removed on 16.10.18, to gradually reduce fertility in the meadow areas. NB growth on natural ground is much less than on new mound in background – where soil is aerated & nitrogen rich.



TRESKERBY – shrubs and perennials looking good. *Verbena bonariensis* still in flower at end of October. Meadow areas neat and ready to flower again next summer. Spring bulbs to be added to the field with Treleigh School on 31.10.18 and 2nd Redruth Scout Group and local community on 03.11.18.



TRESKERBY - young woodland understorey after leaf drop. Guards to holly and honeysuckle ready to be removed, to allow healthy growth. Native woodland bulbs including bluebells and wild garlic to be added in November 2018.
