<b>1</b>	<p><b>Devon &amp; Cornwall Police Update</b></p> <p>See attached report.</p> <p>Sergeant Sue Honeywell has taken over Andy Stewart.</p> <p>Wadebridge Town Council would like some feedback regarding the successes relating to CCTV Footage. It would be useful to have some 'quick wins' to inform the public of how effective CCTV is.</p> <p>CFRS are currently looking to recruit a volunteer who can look through all the CCTV footage so feedback can be produced on incidents.</p> <p>Concern was raised regarding the current levels of PCSOs in the network. There are 5 PCSOs covering the Sector Area, unfortunately 2 PCSOs are on sick leave but hope to be back ASAP.</p> <p>Cllr Rushworth raised concerns around 'County Lines'. County Lines drug activity is a national issue which now a Police priority. County Lines are organised crime networks branching out into our communities. It is not a major issue within the Network Area at the moment but please report anything that is suspicious.</p>	

<p><b>2</b></p>	<p><b>Cornwall Council Draft Budget 2019/20</b></p> <p>Cornwall Councillor Rob Rotchall – Portfolio for Adults Andy Brown – Director for Resources</p> <p>Please see attached presentation</p> <p><u>Clr Stephen Rushworth</u></p> <p><i>How can we, as members of the public, see the borrowing cost of the Council? How much of the Council Tax goes on financing the interest on borrowing?</i></p> <p>The cost of financing capital spend was apportioned within the individual services of the slide that made up where does your £100 go on services.</p> <p>In the published budget book on our website &amp; the published budget papers that go to Scrutiny &amp; Cabinet, there is details on how much the individual service e.g. Transport budget are. Included within that detail is a line called capital financing, which is the budget to pay for interest &amp; repayments on the Councils debt. The revenue budget for that is £51m.</p> <p><i>The Council have an ambitious plan to invest in a Capital Programme for Growth. If something does go wrong, will there be cuts to Adults and Childrens Services in the future?</i></p> <p>AB stated that the Investment Programme is to look at providing housing and work units as part of the Local Plan. The Government Grant will be phased out and the Investment Programme is to give us an income. There is a risk element that has got to be factored in and has been built into the balance.</p> <p><u>Brian Gisborne (St.Minver Highlands &amp; St. Minver Lowlands)</u></p> <p><i>The Council should be cutting money waste by not borrowing to fund the stadium, so as not to incur the interest on the borrowing.</i></p> <p>AB stated that the £3m funds towards the Stadium is not coming from borrowed money but from reserves.</p>	
<p><b>3</b></p>	<p><b>Notes of the last meeting</b></p> <p>The notes where agreed</p>	

<p><b>4</b></p>	<p><b>Warm and Well Cornwall</b></p> <p>The new Winter Wellbeing guide will be available shortly from Libraries, One Stop Shop as well as online. The service offers free central heating to people with health problems and they have also been able to extend this help to people receiving benefits. They hope to help around 1,000 homes across Cornwall and have already engaged with 350.</p> <p><a href="#">Warm and Well Cornwall</a></p> <p>There is a free phone number: 0800 9541956 <b>run</b> by Community Energy Plus who has expertise with regards to what help is available.</p> <p>Discussions took place around 'pay as you go' electricity metres. AB informed the group that the Regulatory Authority (<b>OFGEM</b>) insisted that charges for electricity <b>meters</b> came down, reducing the cost dramatically. There is still a need to engage with people regarding their electricity and gas tariffs as switching providers can also help. <b><i>There is no protection for solid fuel, oil or bottled gas users, but they are encouraged to shop around for the better deals, which impacts on many in rural community network areas.</i></b></p>	
<p><b>5</b></p>	<p><b>SLT Rep Update</b></p> <p>PM gave an overview of the individual T&amp;PC recycling rates see attached slides.</p> <p>The Cabinet will be making decisions on waste collection with regards to maintaining the currently system or changing the current collection schedules.</p> <p>Cllr Graham Martin asked if the Council could encourage food suppliers to use less packaging or use the recycling in schemes such as road resurfacing. PM informed him that investigations are taking place with regards to how recycling could be used in different schemes. There is a need for a drive from consumers to change the views on plastic but it will require proper legislation.</p> <p>PM would welcome ideas on the best way to engage with communities with regards to raising recycling targets.</p> <p>Wadebridge Town Council will be holding a waste awareness</p>	

	<p>campaign in March 2019 at the Town Hall, called 'Wadebridge Rubbish Day Out'. PM is happy for one of his team to support this.</p>	
<p><b>6</b></p>	<p><b>Strengthening Panels – Network Highways Scheme</b></p> <p>AD briefed the panel on the current status of the scheme and the outcome of the Atlantic Terrace Feasibility Study:</p> <p>The Community Network Panel agreed to recommend to Cornwall Council to finalise and implement:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">The outcomes of the Atlantic Terrace Feasibility Study at a cost of £13,200.</p> <p>The commitment to the above scheme means that the panel have committed a total of £28,403 of the Year 1 funds.</p> <p>Due to a change in CLO the year 2 prioritisation will now be tabled at the March meeting.</p>	
<p><b>7</b></p>	<p><b>Cornwall Councillor Update</b></p> <p><u>Carol Mould CC</u></p> <p>Polzeath Parking issues are moving forward.</p> <p><u>Stephen Rushworth CC</u></p> <p>Recommendations to introduce a maintenance service (grass cutting) charge, to Cornwall Council Housing Estates is going to Cabinet in December 2018.</p> <p>The report can be seen <a href="#">here</a></p> <p>Discussions took place around CORMAC being the contractor for the maintenance and that an external contractor would cheaper.</p> <p><b>ACTION:</b> an update to be given at the next meeting</p> <p><u>Karen McHugh CC</u></p> <p>KM informed the panel that the Wadebridge Residents Parking consultation that took place in early summer did not demonstrate enough support to progress and therefore residents parking will not be happening at any time in the foreseeable future.</p>
