Unauthorised motor vehicles on public rights of way

The Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel recently received a presentation from representatives from local rural Parishes on a developing four point plan looking to address issues of unauthorised motor vehicles on public rights of way. The plan is being co-written by Devon and Cornwall Police in support of the Parishes.

One of the key points raised was that to make positive steps in addressing the issues all stakeholders, including Cornwall Council, need to work together in supporting the proposed actions in the draft plan. One of the areas where it is felt that some improvements could be made is in considering the use of suitable physical barriers in appropriate locations which would help to restrict access by motorised vehicles onto the public right of way network from key locations, while maintaining access for legitimate users.

We have agreed to write to you, supporting the draft plan and we would encourage Cornwall Council to actively participate in the proactive partnership to help to tackle this important issue across the Community Network Area.
