Millbrook, although nestled between its neighbouring Rame Peninsula Parishes, is unique in many ways and as such, faces many unique challenges. For example, Millbrook Parish Council owns / manages 3 car parks, a lake, a football club, public conveniences, a play park, a skate park, playing fields, a burial ground, the village hall, a lime kiln and more, making it more akin to a Town Council. The population is much greater than that of our neighbouring parishes – over 2000 people. The percentage of second / holiday homes is far less (believed to be less than 5%) than in say Maker with Rame – ~66%. It is a working village with many more facilities than neighbouring parishes: doctor's surgery, (outreach) post office, supermarket, convenience store, newsagents, 3 pubs, 4 cafes, 2 hairdressers etc. Millbrook's demographic is different – Millbrook Parish Council recently declared a Climate Emergency, where Maker with Rame considered it but voted against it. We face different challenges in terms of crime e.g. drugs, anti-social behaviour. And much more.

In other words, whilst looking on a map it may appear that all of these 'little' parishes on the Rame Peninsula are the same, that couldn't be farther from the truth. As such, Millbrook Parish Council proposes no change.

The existing boundary of Torpoint (East and West Divisions) cover the whole of Torpoint and does not cross any settlements with any other Parish. The current boundary is geographically suitable, with a significant undeveloped green space buffer between parishes. Residents' in the town have a strong identity and an interest in the existing boundary. The town is currently developing a Neighbourhood Development Plan, which the community of Torpoint has contributed towards. Many consultation activities and events have been undertaken to support this, evidence of this is available and there was no evidence to suggest the Neighbourhood Plan should cover any other area. The five parishes of the Rame Peninsula, adjacent to the town boundary, have adopted their Neighbourhood Plan which supports the current boundary.

Torpoint Town Council's precept enables the council to actively and effectively promote the well-being of their residents and to contribute to the real provision of services in their areas in an economic and efficient manner. It takes into account any other arrangements for the purposes of community representation or community engagement in the area that reinforce the 'community of identity' test. This can be evidenced by the recent devolution of assets and services including parks, toilets and the Library.
