1.	<p>Introductions</p> <p>Cllr Wells welcomed everyone and invited Mark O'Brien to advise on the health and safety and housekeeping.</p> <p>Representatives introduced themselves.</p> <p>Apologies were noted as above</p>	
2.	<p>Election of Community Network Panel Chair & Vice Chair</p> <p>Mark invited nominations from the members for Chair of the Panel. Following discussions, there was a unanimous decision:</p> <p>Chris Wells was duly elected as the Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel Chair for the next 12 months.</p> <p>Councillor Wells thanked everyone for their support and took back chairing responsibilities for the meeting.</p> <p>Councillor Chris Wells invited nomination from the members for Vice-Chair. Parish Councillors Rob Knill (Chacewater PC) and Councillor Nicholas Gillard (PC) were put forward. Following a vote, Councillor Gillard received 6 votes and Councillor Knill received 3 votes.</p> <p>Councillor Nicholas Gillard was elected as the Truro and Roseland Community Network Panel Vice-Chair for the next 12 months</p>	
3.	<p>Terms of Reference</p> <p>The issue of Climate Change is to be incorporated into the Terms of Reference.</p>	
4.	<p>Schedule of Meetings</p> <p>The schedule of meetings was provisionally agreed.</p>	

5.	<p>Mental Health Services & Support</p> <p><u>Hear Our Voice – Young People Cornwall</u></p> <p>Charlotte Brasier – Support Worker, YPC India – Young person Chelsea-Marie – Young person</p> <p>India and Chelsea provided an insightful, informative and personal account of their own challenges with mental health as well as praising the support of the organisation that they were representing.</p> <p>“The best and most inspirational presentation ever given at one of these meetings” was the consensus from the panel members.</p> <p>The Mind Your Way website has been set up by young people, for young people and provides load of information, tools and resources and you can self-refer through it.</p> <p>Link to presentation</p> <p>Cllr Rob Knill enquired as to whether local Youth Clubs are well received by young people. He was informed that often a Youth Club is an important place for young people as it offers them a safe place and somewhere to go.</p> <p>Discussions took place around the pressures of school contributing to mental health. Previously teachers and schools didn’t understand mental health but there are measures now being put in place to target this. One example is that Youth Workers are being placed into schools that are then able to make referrals to the relevant services.</p> <p>All present at the meeting congratulated the guest speakers on a very informative presentation, along with the clarity of the information.</p> <p><u>Nick Millward – Cornwall Council Social Emotional and Mental Health County Strategic Lead</u></p> <p>Please see attached presentation. Nick Millward provided a detailed presentation around the Special Educational Needs (SEN) support and services to school in Cornwall. More details around the range of services provided can be found at: Special Educational Needs</p> <p>Cornwall currently has the highest need with regards to Social Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH), 25% of school children require extra support, but has the lowest funding. One example of this is Feock which is a bit of a “hot spot” of recorded SEMH cases. There could be a number of factors one of</p>	
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which may be the parent will push for the services, deprived areas seem less likely to access services for a number of reasons and cases are missed.

The majority of young people excluded from schools is due to SEMH. The LA has been successful in a bid for specialist SEMH school. This will be built in Bodmin which will dovetail with the existing school and services.

A new Personal, Social, Health and Economic education program is being commissioned. This will use CBT techniques to support young people's SEMH, thus allowing them to cope and help prevent mental health issues developing. In addition there will be an expansion in the school nursing offer with all secondary schools being allocated a school nurse.

There is also a development / offer from CAMHS. As of September there will be a Clinical Associate psychologist (CAP) who will be co-located in each secondary school. They will be based within CAMHS but work with cases from their geographical / schools area.

Sheelah Goldsmith raised concerns around 4/5G mobile phone signal and the effect she felt this is having on mental health and the environment around us.

Councillor Wells mentioned about the effect social media can have on the well-being of children and young people

CLlr Nicholas Gillard thanked Nick Millward for a comprehensive informative presentation and asked what intervention can be looked at that would make a difference to a young person's mental health.

Nick Millward stated that the top 3 factors that contribute to a young person's mental health are:

- *Relationships*, often not forming a good relationship with the teachers/school can have an impact
- *Family*, a complex home life play a major part in mental health
- *Diet / Energy Drinks / food poverty*, eating the wrong foods, not having enough food and consuming stimulants are all factors causing issues in school and the potential development of a SEMH need

6.	<p>Notes of the last two meetings (19 March & 22 May 2019)</p> <p><u>Notes from 19th March 2019</u></p> <p><u>Police & Crime Update</u> <i>Cllr Rob Knill also stated that Chacewater Parish are frustrated that the Speedwatch Scheme still appears to be on hold. Rick Milburn apologised for the issues and lack of support and assured members that this issue is being considered Force wide. The SpeedWatch process is still stalled while the process is looked at centrally.</i> ACTION: Rick Milburn and Cllr Rob Knill to liaise further regarding this. The issue is no further forward.</p> <p><u>Climate Emergency Declaration</u> Correction of the spelling of Cllr Lindsey Southcombe.</p> <p><u>Issued Raised by Panel Member</u> Feock Parish Council Cllr Caroline Johnson raised awareness of the Community Transport Scheme, not the bus as stated in the notes.</p> <p>Loic Rich CC <i>Loic Rich would like an update with regard to the Truro Household Recycling Centre as a number of issues have arisen. He would like reassurance that there will be no delays in the opening date.</i></p> <p>Mark O'Brien informed the group that Cornwall Council has now appointed a new contractor, CORMAC, and it is hoped that the work will be completed by the end of the year.</p>	

	<p><u>Notes from 22 May 2019 – Extraordinary Meeting Highways Budget</u></p> <p>The draft notes were agreed as a true and accurate record of the meeting.</p> <p>Mark drew Panel Members’ attention to the slight increase in costs for the two feasibility studies (St. Clement and St. Erme Parish Councils) which had been received following the meeting held on the 22nd May.</p> <p>As these were in effect only minor increases, with agreement from Councillor Wells, Mark had confirmed with CORMAC colleagues to progress with the feasibility studies to avoid any further delays.</p> <p>It was suggested that the Panel considers launching a second call for expressions of interest for further highways schemes at a time which would enable the results of the feasibility studies to be known .This would enable these Parishes to submit a further expression of interest seeking funding for the delivery of any preferred options that have been agreed.</p>
