1.	<p>Introductions</p> <p>Cllr Wells welcomed everyone and thanked St. Erme Parish Council for hosting the meeting. He asked Mark O'Brien to advise on the health and safety and housekeeping.</p> <p>Representatives introduced themselves.</p> <p>Apologies were noted as above</p>	
2.	<p>Inspector Rick Milburn – Devon and Cornwall Police</p> <p>Please see the attached report.</p> <p>Cllr Richard Brickell raised concerns around an incident that took place in Feock involving an older lady in the middle of the night. A Police Officer did not follow up on the incident until a week later.</p> <p>ACTION: RB to contact Inspt Milburn outside of this meeting.</p> <p>Cllr Richard Brickell went onto enquire about police presence on the roads at night, targeting vehicles with no working lights. Inspt Milburn stated that policing the rural roads is a challenge with only 5 officers covering the area. Traffic Officers, who are centralised officers, are deployed to where there are high road traffic accident numbers.</p> <p>https://www.devon-cornwall.police.uk/ - follow the link to upload your dash cam footage, the link can be found half way down the webpage - Operation Snap</p> <p>Following a question from Councillor Knill about a multi-area approach aiming to tackle the issue of illegal vehicles on public rights of way, Inspt Milburn informed the group that they are currently trying to identify a candidate from this Policing Sector to support the work of the group.</p>	RB

	<p>James Hosking has now been assigned to work on the Community Speed Watch Schemes.</p> <p>ACTION: Inspt Milburn will ensure that James Hosking visits Chacewater PC as they are aware there is an issue in the Parish.</p> <p>The Police and Crime Commissioner Alison Hernandez confirmed that with a national plan of 20,000 additional officers there could be 450 for Cornwall. Cllr Julian German CC raised concern around the capacity of training the possible new recruits. Inspt Milburn informed him that a possible solution could be to re-open Regional Training Centres, but yes it will come with a lot of issues that will require investigating.</p> <p>Cllr Nicholas Gillard thanked Inspt Milburn for an excellent presentation. Discussions took place around diversions when a road traffic accident takes place and whether those diversions are the best decision. Inspt Milburn stated that once an incident takes place there are so many variables and often a snap judgement call is made, the diversion is put in place by the Police and not Highways and understand it's not always an ideal result.</p>	<p>Insp Milburn / JH</p>
<p>3.</p>	<p>Local Education Development Plan</p> <p>Helen Peerless (Education and Early Years Sufficiency Manager) and Sharon Hindley (Head of Education Access and Sufficiency) ran through the attached slides.</p> <p>Primary School provision is sufficient as it currently stands, meaning the current demand enables every child can be offered a school place.</p> <p>Cllr John Dyer CC raised concerns around the capacity of Threemilestone Primary School with regards to the planned Langarth Development.</p> <p>The current Threemilestone School will not be rebuilt as part of the Langarth Development. The school is part of a larger multi agency Academy Trust so they can apply to the CIF fund to improve the building or expand. This would be supported by the Department for Education. New education provision will be provided and it is planned for a new school being built at the start of the development.</p> <p>Cornwall Council are not allowed to extend a school because it's popular.</p>	

	<p>Cllr Loic Rich CC registered an interested as he is currently a Governor at Tregolls School.</p> <p>Cllr Loic Rich CC raised concerns around Richard Lander School having the space to expand but will they have the teachers? He was informed that a feasibility study is currently taking place at Richard Lander School.</p> <p>By 2030 there will be a need to supply a new secondary school.</p> <p>Cllr Martyn Alvey CC asked whether education plans are linked in with Neighbourhood Plans and was informed they are linked in with Neighbourhood Planning Officers.</p> <p>Cllr Martyn Alvey CC stated that currently the recommend level of section 106 contributions do not cover the cost of the infrastructure that is needed to support the developments.</p> <p><i>ACTION: To look into query regarding planning application at Carnon Downs</i></p> <p>Cllr Armorel Carlyon raised a query around school transport and was informed that the school transport budget is £16m per year and now sits in Economic Growth and Development.</p> <p>Louise Wood has further details regarding the Langarth Economic and Development Fund.</p> <p>Cllr Rob Trethewey asked about the possibility of Trispen/St.Erme School having an extra classroom. It was confirmed this was not currently a priority that met the criteria of the LA's Basic Need programme. Trispen/St.Erme School has previously taken overflow children from Truro but current forecasting does not indicate this will be a problem in the future.</p> <p>The new Nansledan School was delivered through the government's central free school programme, with significant contribution from the Duchy. The design was driven by the Duchy.</p> <p><i>ACTION:</i> It was agreed to set up Workshops/Consultation Exercises involving Cllrs, residents, parents and children etc.</p>	<p>HP</p> <p>HP / MOB</p>

This was agreed by the Panel.</p>
