

# Carbon Neutral Cornwall Partnership Group *Membership Role Profile*



## **Group function**

The role of the group is to contribute to the ongoing delivery of the Carbon Neutral Cornwall programme. The group will provide a broad range of perspectives and leadership based on their sector experience through a systems thinking approach, which will influence and inform the actions taken by Cornwall Council and other stakeholders towards the goal of carbon neutrality by 2030. The group will also ensure that sector appropriate advice is provided to ensure that discussions and actions are informed and appropriate.

Actions taken at meetings will include mapping of existing actions across sectors, identifying opportunities and barriers for further actions and exploring new approaches to enable these actions.

## **Membership criteria**

It is expected that members of this board will be leaders in their field with the ability to either share their organisation's strategic intent or initiate actions based on agreed priorities. Members of the group will represent key sectors working across Cornwall and beyond, including but not limited to traditional carbon-emitting sectors. Members should be willing to commit time to the requirements of the group, and act as gatekeepers to their wider networks, ensuring that they are equipped to offer advice and guidance on the contribution that their sector can make.

## **Commitment**

Just as the knowledge, skills and experiences of the members will be important, so too will the ability and desire to contribute to the group and the wider Carbon Neutral Cornwall programme. Members will be expected to commit to the following:

1. Quarterly meetings in person, lasting for half a day. These will be hosted at collectively agreed locations, starting with New County Hall in Truro;
2. Taking agreed actions outside of meetings, including collecting information for meetings, identifying opportunities for discussion and approaching invitees to input into future meetings;
3. Where appropriate, attending online meetings to advance specific projects or discussions;
4. Contributing to the ongoing assessment of the group.

While we understand that unforeseen circumstances will sometimes make attending or contributing difficult, we ask that all potential members commit to attending all meetings, and where attendance becomes unexpectedly impossible they take responsibility for ensuring that a briefed replacement attends who can represent a similar perspective.
