



NOTICE OF MODIFICATION ORDER

SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE AND COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981

DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT FOR THE FORMER CARADON DISTRICT COUNCIL AREA

THE CORNWALL COUNCIL (ADDITION OF A FOOTPATH AT TRERIEVE, DOWNDERRY IN THE PARISH OF DEVIOCK) MODIFICATION ORDER 2022

The above order made on 25 January 2022, if confirmed as made, will modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

Adding a length of Public Footpath in the Parish of Deviock commencing at unclassified road U6151 'Trerieve' approximately 26 metres north-west of '44 Trerieve Estate' at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SX 3159/5413 shown as point 'A' on the attached Order map then continuing in a generally easterly then northerly direction for a distance of 165 metres terminating on unclassified road U6151 'Devioc Hill' approximately 73 metres west of '22 Trerieve Estate' at OSGR SX 3164/5427 shown as point 'B' on the attached Order map.

Any representation about or objection to the Order must be sent in writing to the Senior Natural Environment Records Officer, Cornwall Council, PO Box 676, Threemilestone, Truro, TR1 9EQ (quoting the reference WCA 544) not later than 16th March 2022, stating the grounds on which they are made.

If no representations of objections are duly made to the order, (or to any part of it), or if any so made are withdrawn, the Cornwall Council, instead of submitting the order to the Secretary of State (or part of it if the authority has by notice to the Secretary of State so elected under paragraph 5 of Schedule 15 to the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981) may itself confirm the order (or that part of the order). If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State (in whole or in part) any representations or objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with it.
