



## **NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF MODIFICATION ORDER**

### **SECTION 53 OF THE WILDLIFE & COUNTRYSIDE ACT 1981**

#### **DEFINITIVE MAP & STATEMENT OF PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY FOR THE FORMER CARRICK DISTRICT AREA**

#### **THE CORNWALL COUNCIL (ADDITION OF A RESTRICTED BYWAY AT MYLOR BRIDGE IN THE PARISH OF MYLOR) MODIFICATION ORDER 2022**

On 26 April 2022, Cornwall Council confirmed the above order made under section 53[(2)(b)] of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to modify the definitive map and statement for the area by:

Adding a length of Restricted Byway in the Parish of Mylor commencing at Unclassified Road U6066, approximately 16 metres west-north-west of "Tregatreath House", at Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SW 8065/3578 shown as point "A" on the attached Order map, then running in a generally north-north-easterly direction for a distance of 31 metres terminating at the foreshore of Mylor Creek approximately 32 metres north-north-west of "Tregatreath House" at OSGR SW 8066/3581 shown as point "B" on the attached Order map.

The order comes into force on the day that it is confirmed but if any person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity on the ground that that it is not within the powers of Section 53 of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981, or on the ground that any requirement of Schedule 15 of the Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may under paragraph 12 (1) of Schedule 15 to the Act within six weeks from 5 May 2022, make application to the High Court.
