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## **APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATE ALTERNATIVE DEVELOPMENT LAND COMPENSATION ACT 1961, SECTION 17 AS SUBSTITUTED BY SECTION 63 OF THE PLANNING COMPENSATION ACT 1991**

### Footnotes:

- 1 The application may be made by a surveyor appointed to value land where the owner is absent abroad or cannot be found. It can also be made by the acquiring Authority.
- 2 If application is made by the Authority or by a surveyor, a copy must be served on the owner.
- 3 A plan or map sufficient to identify the land should be annexed and the land edged in red.
