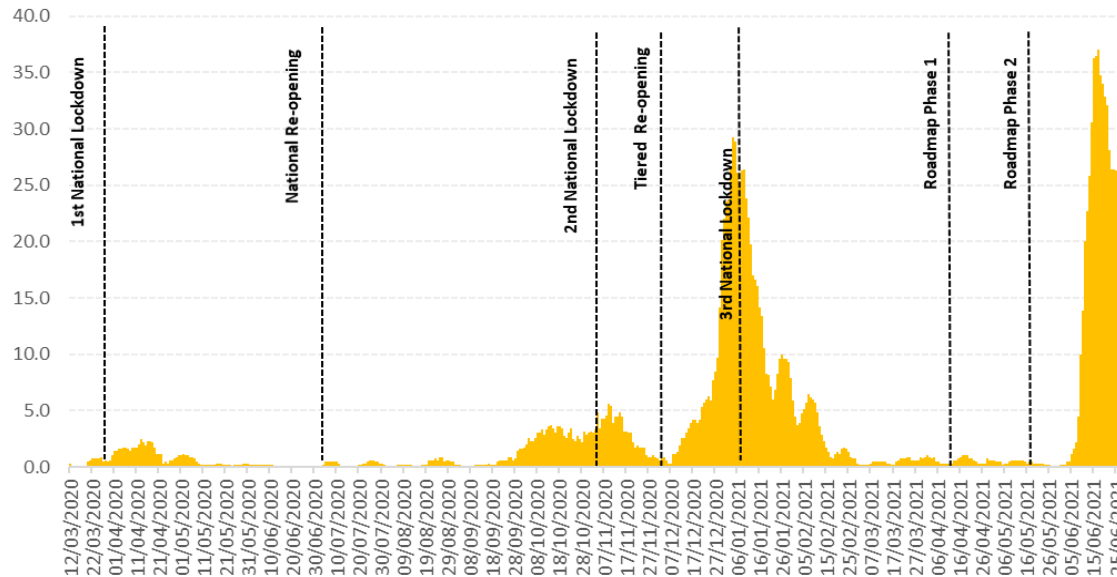

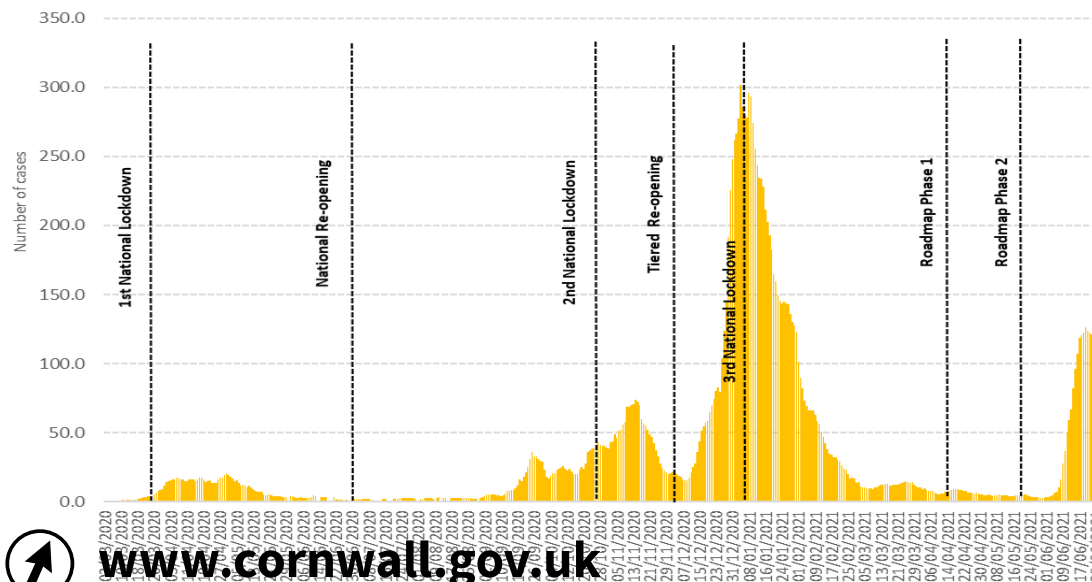

COVID-19 Cases over the course of the Pandemic

Falmouth and Penryn COVID 19 Cases: 7 Day Rolling Average



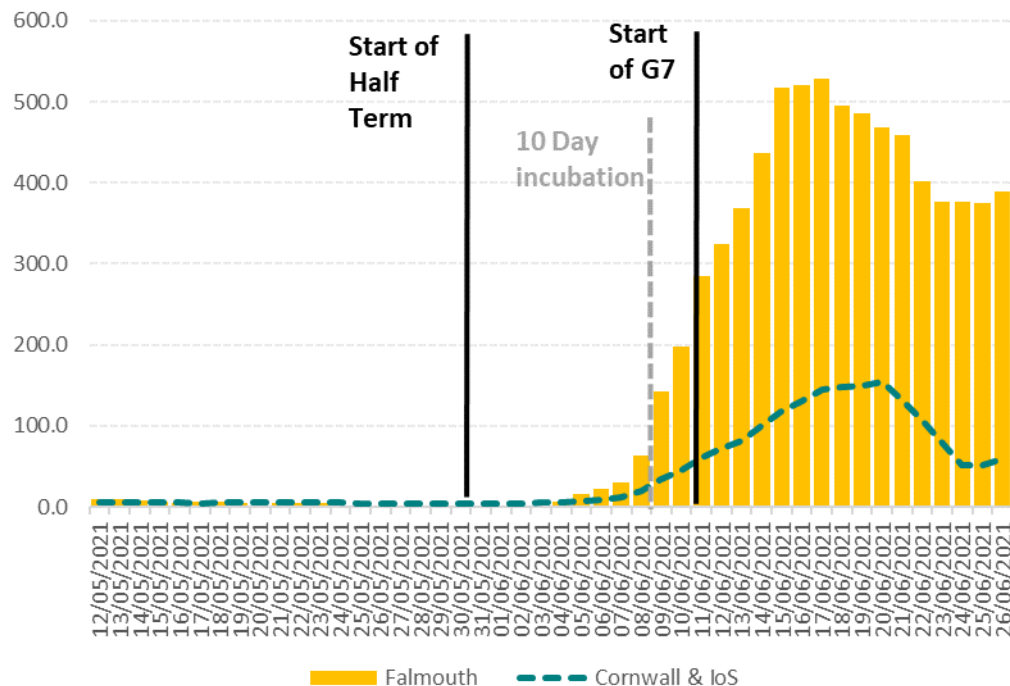
Cornwall & IoS COVID 19 Cases: 7 Day Rolling Average



Whilst the positive case trends have largely mirrored the situation across Cornwall and Isles of Scilly, in recent weeks we have seen cases rise faster in Falmouth and Penryn 7 day cases for Falmouth and Penryn are now higher than seen during the last wave of COVID-19 seen between Dec 2020 and February 2021.

COVID-19 7 Day Case Rate Per 100,000



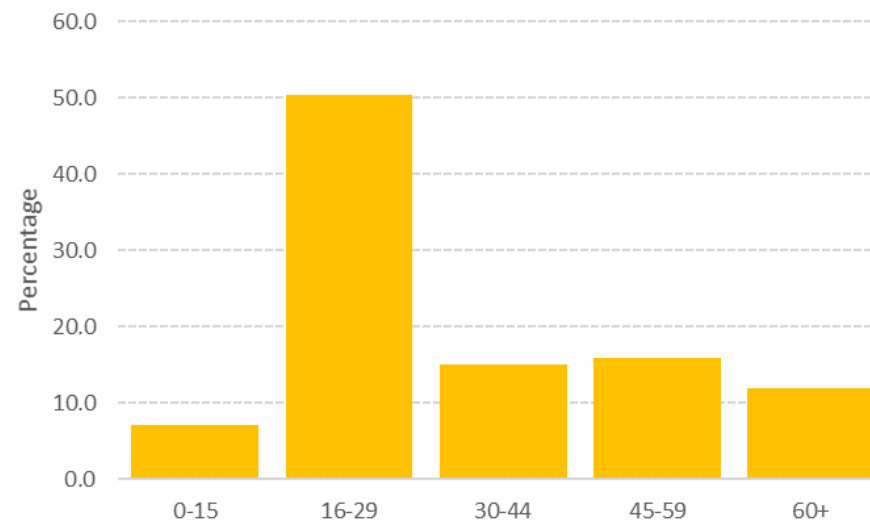
389 per 100,000

Is the 7 day case rate as at 26/06/21. This compares to 59.5 for Cornwall and Isles of Scilly over the same period [please note figures are subject to change]

Falmouth and Penryn Cases by Age



Actions taken to date:

1. Working with the University as soon as cases started to be identified.
2. Working with individual businesses as soon as cases and contacts started being identified.
3. Pulled a meeting together of interested parties on Friday 18th June to develop a broader and more inclusive plan for the area.
4. Using voluntary sector and local business support to distribute leaflets around the town about Covid Safe practices.
5. Business support and local member have delivered LFD testing to businesses to get them started on 2 x weekly testing regimens.
6. Extensive comms support with all messaging re: Covid safe practices shared with Town and Parish Councils, Community Link Offices and members for onward sharing.
7. Sought advice from PHE wrt surge testing and reviewing regularly
8. Worked with the local NHS to ensure access to Vaccinations for young people in the Falmouth area are prioritised.

Vaccination offers in Falmouth

Stithians have now opened for walk in's to all people aged 18 and over who need their first vaccine 9am -6pm daily (with Pfizer vaccine)

Falmouth Health Centre have an additional 90 bookable slots and 90 walk in slots for Friday 2nd July

NHS reviewing uptake in the Falmouth areas and will amend the offer to local residents as necessary
